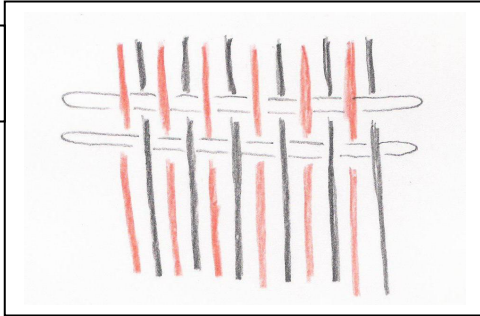


Beginning Finger Weaving

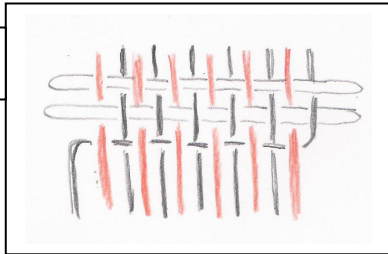
Two color Stipple

1



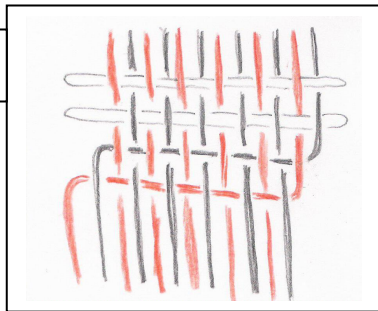
The first cross.
Threads are aligned parallel to each other
in 'one up, one down' order.
All threads are Warp.

2



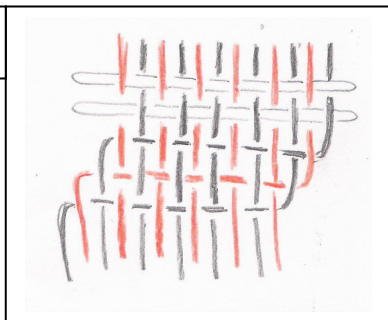
Rightmost thread plays Weft
moving to the right, in an under-
one, over-one pattern.
At the end of the row, the thread
returns to Warp position

Next rightmost thread plays Weft,
moving to the right, in an under-one,
over-one pattern.
At the end of the row, the thread
returns to Warp position

4



Carry on in the same manner.
Note: weft always goes over its own color
and under the contrasting color.

Definition of terms

Warp – Lengthwise thread in a cloth

Weft – Sideways thread in a cloth
